Vocabulary

Vocabulary is key to understanding the content of this class, the AP Test and what you hear in class. For each unit you have vocabulary words to learn. To make sure that you are learning the geographic definition of a word, a Quizlet class has been set up for you to join. Go to: https://quizlet.com/join/5c3jAWnHp to join. You are joining MSMITHAPHUG. You will need to wait to be approved - approval only happens during school hours.

Unit Vocab

At the start of each unit, a set of unit vocabulary will be added to the class for you to learn. The words are listed on your unit information sheet. You are expected to know the definition and be able to apply the words to examples. In each unit you will have a vocabulary quiz. The quiz will ask you to match the words to an example of the word, not necessarily the definition. The quiz has fifteen to twenty of the vocabulary words chosen randomly.

College Board/ AP

Advanced Placement is part of College Board – the same group that gives the SAT. In order to participate in AP you need to create a College Board Account and then sign up for the correct section of this class. Do to this go to: <u>https://apstudents.collegeboard.org/join-your-class-online</u> and follow the directions. You class join code is:______ It is different for every teacher and period – so please do not share it with others. You need to complete this by September 27th.

AP Test

The deadline to sign up for the AP test is earlier this year per College Board deadlines. By joining the class via College Board you are registered for the test, but you will still need to pay. See the AP website on the Issaquah High School website for all the deadlines, costs & how to pay. If you do not want to take the AP test – you still need to sign up on College Board, just let your teacher know or Ms. Jansen the AP coordinator know before October 30 that you will not be taking the test. You will still have access to resources on the AP website, but a test will not be reserved for you. If paying for the test is an issue, see Ms. Jansen.
